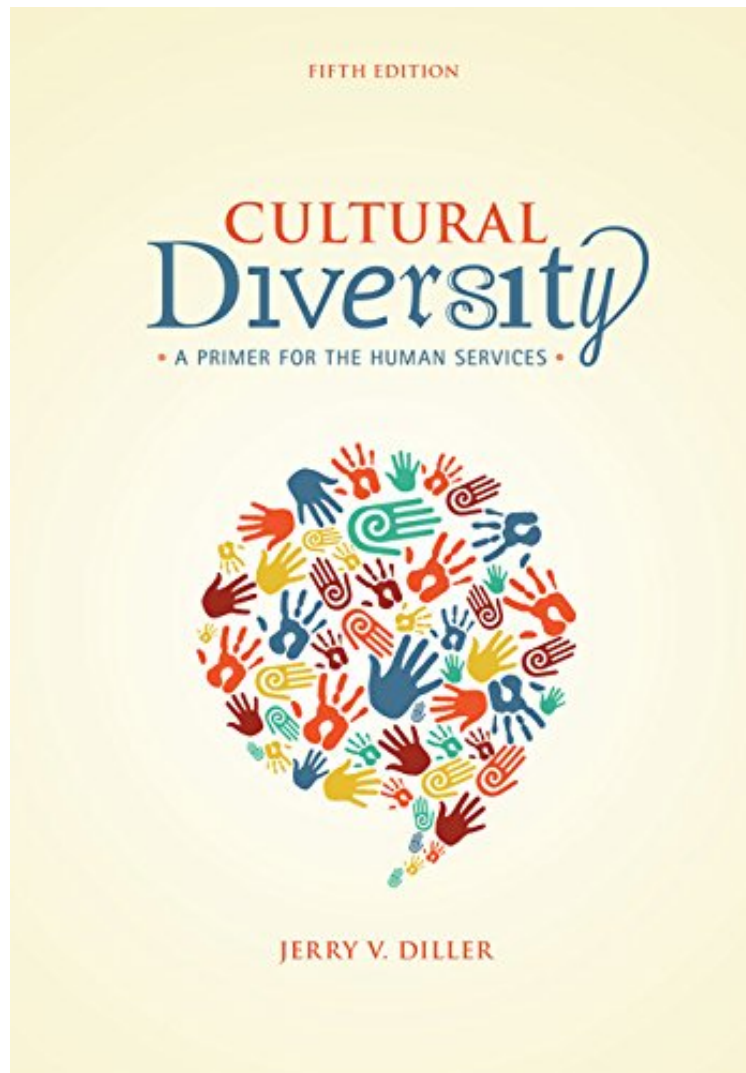

Somewhat politically-slanted in the first chapter and too restrictive to what cultural diversity really is.
