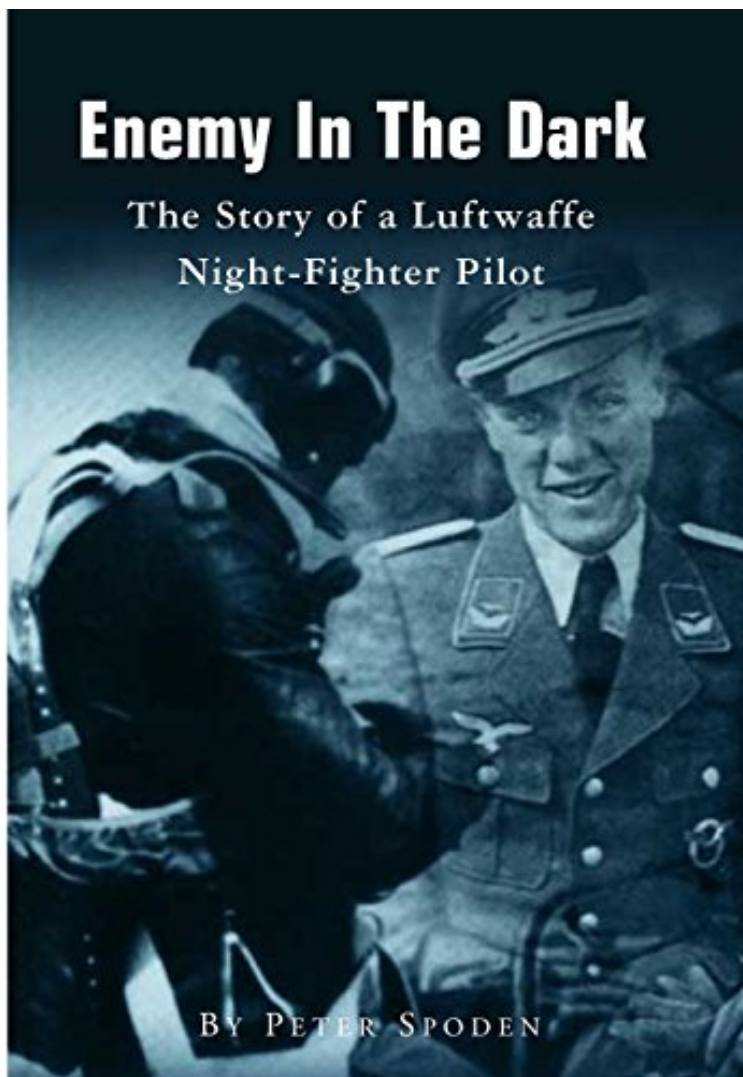

The autobiography of Peter Spoden provides insight into his childhood and upbringing, as well as detailing his wartime and post-war career, and the part he played in the short but remarkable history of the Nachtjagd.
