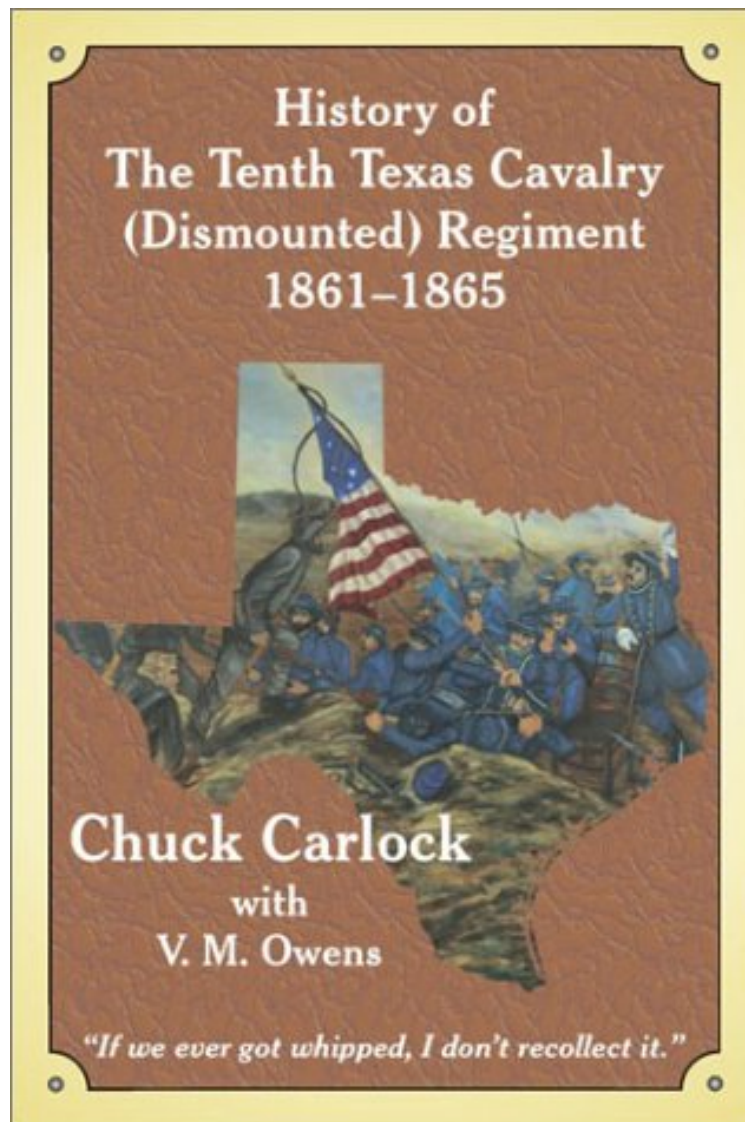

Genealogical ValueBy Mark ReidChuck Carlock has produced an excellent resource for genealogical research on the men who served in the Tenth Texas Cavalry. Mr. Carlock has included information from letters, casualty reports, and other sources in addition to the information available in the National Archives.The book contains a detailed account, frequently described in letters from the actual participants, of each battle. Perhaps more interesting are the descriptions of conditions between engagements, and of the travels to various localities.I recommend the book to anyone with an interest in Civil War history and/or an interest in the men who served.

Presents an account of Chuck's experiences as a helicopter pilot in Vietnam and gives the history of a different era. This book tells the story of a cavalry regiment with no horses, full of wild and reckless Texas boys who were hard to manage, but good in a fight.

About the AuthorNative Texan Chuck Carlock lives in Fort Worth, where he is the director of taxes for a prominent Texas family. His position involves the structuring of some of the nation's largest business deals. Chuck is married to his high school sweetheart and has three daughters and four grandchildren. Chuck served in the U.S. Army for four years, including one year as a combat helicopter pilot in Vietnam, fighting in all three Tet offensives. In 1994, he wrote the best-selling book, Firebirds, about his combat experiences. The proceeds from the sales of that book are donated to the Firebirds military association. After leaving the military, he graduated from the University of Texas at Arlington and became a certified public accountant. Chuck's mother was a Hamilton. Her grandfather was Alvin Finley Hamilton, who served in the Tenth Texas. A. F. Hamilton was raised and buried in the area close to Taylor, Texas, around Austin. He was living near Gilmer, Texas when the Tenth Texas was formed and he joined Company B, the "Wood County Rebels." He was one of the ones "spoiling for a fight." V. M.
