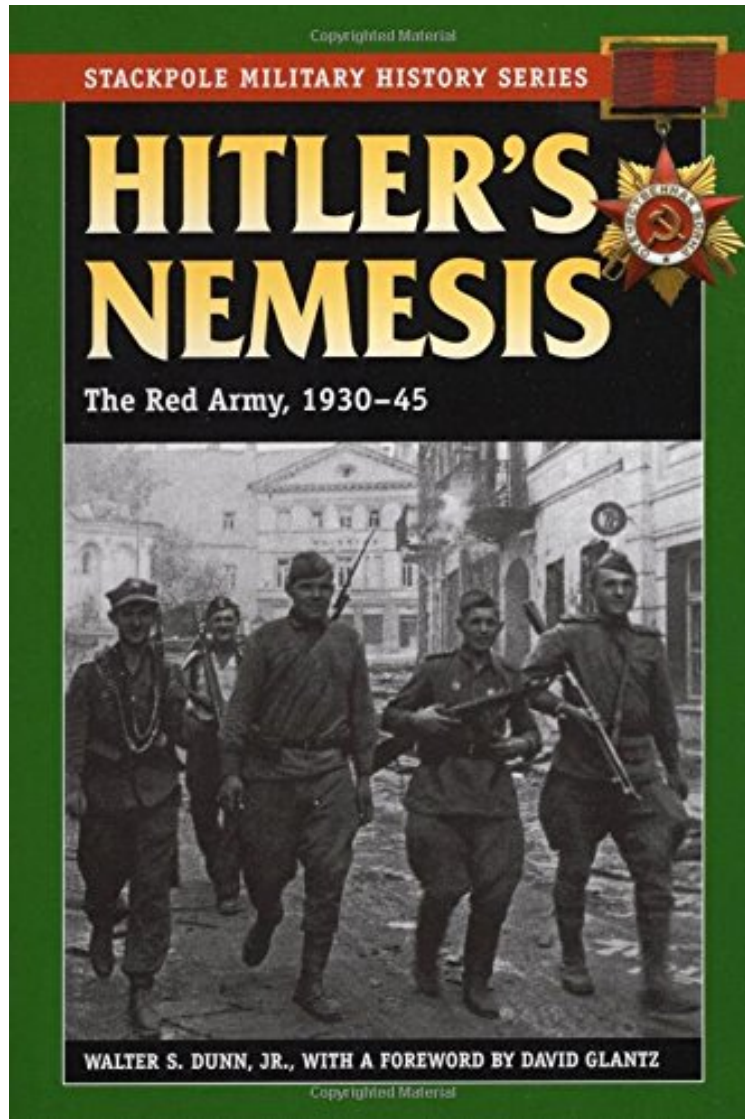

The evolution of all major (infantry, tank, artillery) Soviet military ground forces is told in weapons evolution, doctrine evolution, and unit structure composition evolution. He explains how the Soviet industries were functioning on a "total war footing" long before the Germans Speer moved to that level. He shows the evolutions of weapons based on "what works", "what is really needed at the front", and "what can be manufactured for multiple purposes". He explains why Soviet doctrine functioned the way it did. He explains how Soviet unit structure composition evolved due to weaponry advances, field usage, and improved unit training.
