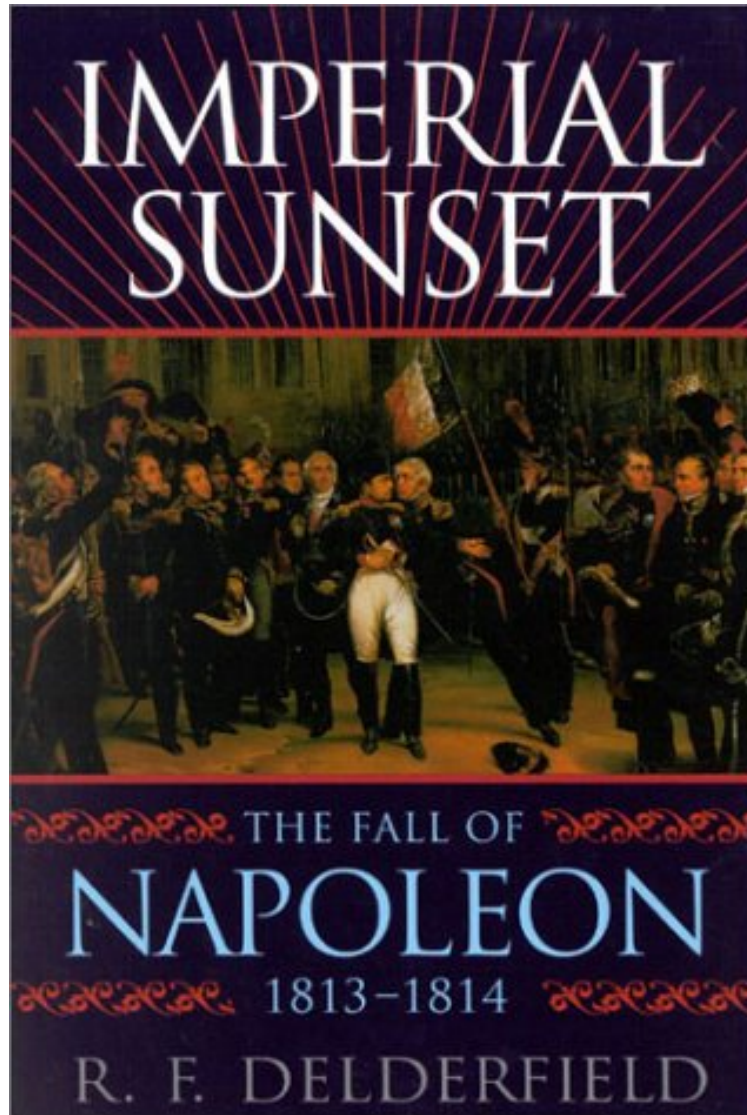

I therefore expanded to read his take on the 1813-1814 campaigns and found it just as good. The book starts at the end of the Russian campaign and goes until Napoleon's abdication in 1814. It covers the great campaign across Germany and France and explains them in great detail. The author writes from the view point of the average soldier often referring to works that describe what it was

like to be a French conscript in 1813 and 1814. He refers to the hardship of marching, the bravery and the starvation that followed.
