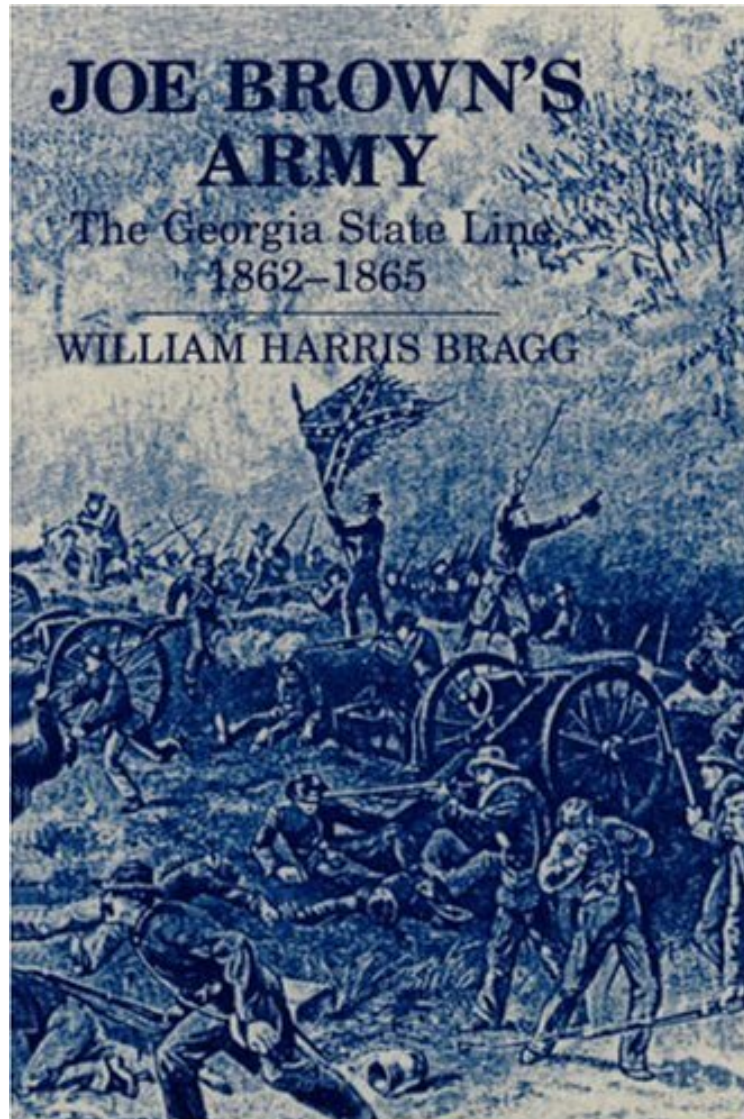

The GSL was a crack outfit by any standard, despite being no more than a state militia, and its contributions in the Atlanta and Georgia Campaigns have been sadly overlooked until now. I was pleasantly surprised to find that this book is an entertaining read as well, not common in these narrow subject histories.
