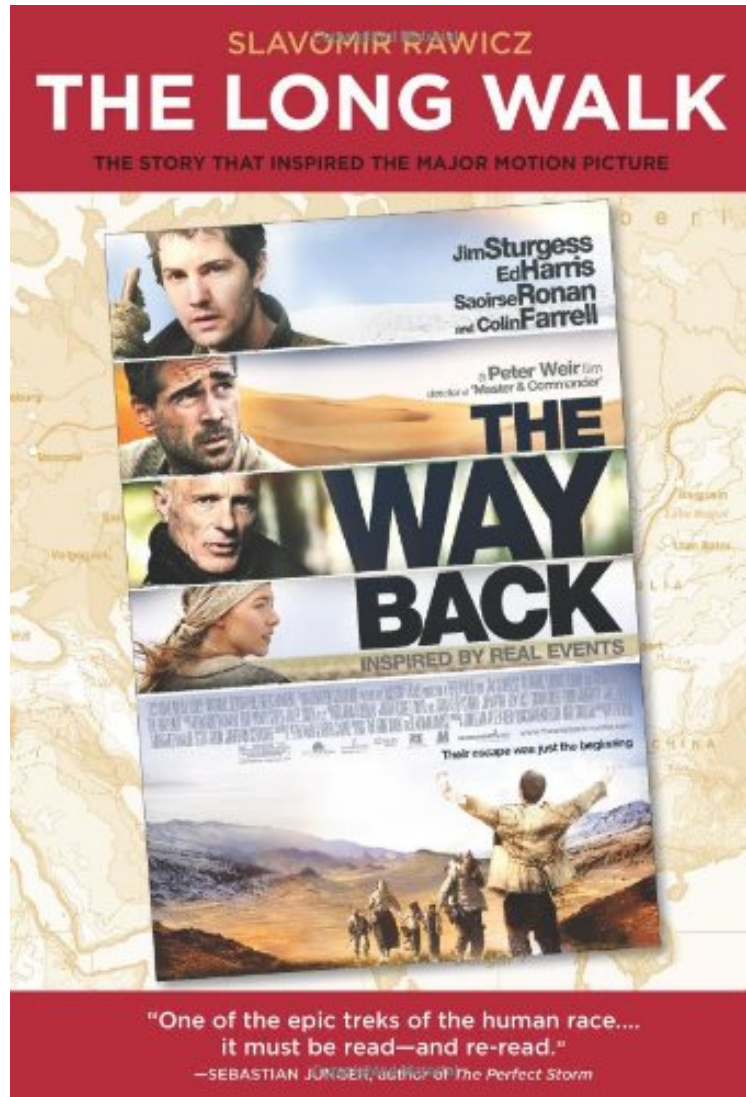

It says much for the human spirit and the desire for freedom. There are a couple of things in the Kindle version that seemed to have been dropped from the original version. One was that some of the escapees ate locusts following a locust storm and millions of them were lying, dead and alive; others could not be made to try them. There was a locust storm in the Kindle version, but no mention of eating or not eating them. An occurrence at the labor camp in Siberia was not mentioned in the Kindle version.
