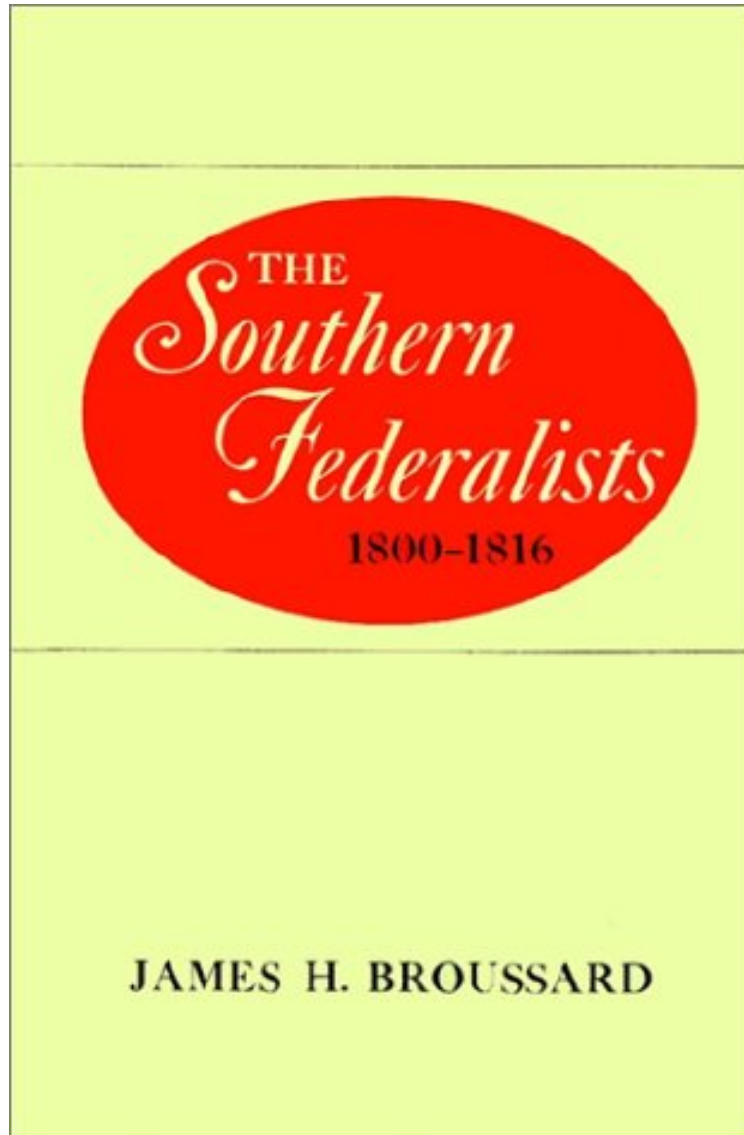

Using previously unavailable data, *The Southern Federalists* presents a thorough analysis of the historical, demographic, and economic voter patterns of our first party system. Although national origin, religion, wealth, and support for the Constitution were the bases of Federalism in other areas, the only factor common to southern Federalists was their deep fear of France. When this fear was put to rest by Napoleon's final defeat in 1815, there was no further need for the Federalists to remain a cohesive party.
