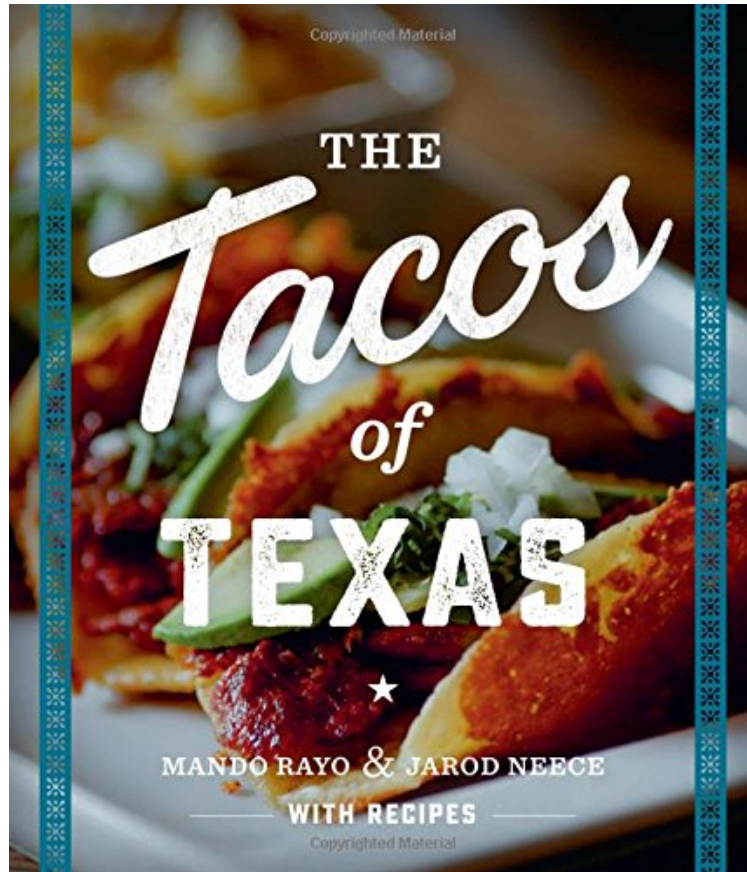

Rooted in tradición mexicana and infused with Texas food culture, tacos are some of Texans' all-time favorite foods. In *The Tacos of Texas*, the taco journalists Mando Rayo and Jarod Neece take us on a muy sabroso taco tour around the state as they discover the traditions, recipes, stories, and personalities behind puffy tacos in San Antonio, trompo
